2026 A WORD FROM LARRY & SHAUN

Dear Friends & Fellow Hazelnut Growers,

The 2025 Oregon hazelnut crop has given all of us a renewed sense of optimism about the future of our industry. Excellent weather, strong yields, outstanding quality, and firmer pricing created one of the most encouraging crop years we have seen in a long time. The 2025 season further reinforced that the Oregon hazelnut industry is resilient, competitive, and uniquely positioned for continued success.

Oregon's 2025 production increased significantly over 2024, and it is now clear once again that Oregon will remain the world's second largest supplier of hazelnuts. Internal estimates indicate that the 2025 crop will exceed 120,000–125,000 U.S. tons (110,000–113,000 metric tons), representing a 22–26% increase over the prior year. This growth gives George Packing Company (GPC), Northwest Hazelnut Company (NWH), and Hazelnut Growers of Oregon (HGO) a remarkable opportunity to continue positioning Oregon hazelnuts as the high quality and dependable choice for the global food industry.

We are deeply grateful to Oregon and Northwest growers for delivering such exceptional product this year. Early and frequent harvesting helped protect quality, resulting in some of the lowest mold levels, lowest rancidity, and lowest dockage we have seen. When a crop is this clean, it is easier to process and easier to sell — and customers around the world have taken notice.

As Turkish and Italian sellers struggled with degraded product, speculative pricing, and cascading supply chain disruptions, buyers increasingly turned to Oregon for reliability, quality, and consistency.

Throughout this turbulent global market, GPC/NWH/HGO focused on expanding market reach, strengthening long term relationships, constant innovation and product R&D, and introducing Oregon hazelnuts to new customers domestically and internationally. These efforts helped move much of the Oregon crop at excellent prices and carry over is expected to be minimal.

In 2024, we integrated Hazelnut Growers of Oregon (HGO) into our team, and the 2025 season demonstrated the strength of that investment. The plant continued to progress toward full modernization, supporting record efficiencies and improved quality across our combined operations. We remain committed to our transparent, fixed fee processing model and to long term, stable, grower focused investments that strengthen our collective future.

As we look ahead to the 2026 season, we are encouraged by Oregon's strong global reputation, rapidly expanding market opportunities, and the exceptional quality delivered by our growers. With your continued partnership, we will maintain the strongest, most transparent hazelnut supply chain in the world.

This Grower Guide is designed to give you useful, practical tools to prepare for the upcoming harvest. Thank you for your continued trust in us and for your dedication to producing the world's finest hazelnuts.

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
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OREGON'S GROWTH HAZELNUT PRODUCTION


Our industry has experienced 19 years of rapid growth and expansion, with the total acreage nearly tripling in size. Fully mature and producing acreage currently stands between 50,000-70,000 acres, while about 64,000 new acres have been planted since 2008. Total acreage for the hazelnut industry is over 97,000 acres, while new orchards are still being planted at a slower rate. Some farmers are transitioning from crops like cane berries and grass seed to hazelnuts as the popularity of hazelnuts grows. Older hazelnut orchards susceptible to the Eastern Filbert Blight are being removed at a rate of around 500-1,000 acres per year.

INTERESTING FACT

The Willamette Valley produces 11% of the world's hazelnuts, but 99% of the U.S. hazelnut harvest.

HAZELNUT PRODUCTION WORLD MARKETS



The Willamette Valley has become a global force in hazelnut production—delivering 7% of the world’s supply in 2024 and 11% in 2025. Nearly every hazelnut grown in the U.S. (99%) comes from Oregon. With Turkey leading at nearly 2/3 production, Oregon has established itself as one of the top two hazelnut-producing regions in the world, showcasing the quality and flavor of our local hazelnuts.

OREGON HAZELNUT VARIETIES

The Oregon State University (OSU) traditional hazelnut breeding effort dates to the 1960s, developed by visionary growers looking to the future. OSU leads the team of breeders and extension scientists who develop new, highly productive, disease-resistant varieties. This guide illustrates the main varieties traditionally grown and currently being planted in the Willamette Valley.




HOW TO CHOOSE NEW PLANTINGS

Before planting a new orchard, one should give serious consideration to varieties, orchard design, orchard site (soil and slope suitability), pre-plant soil management, and other factors. Some varieties are much more sensitive to Eastern Filbert Blight (EFB). See the chart below for a relative spectrum of EFB susceptibility. With new plantings, one should consider mixing in a number of pollen-compatible varieties, with suggestions at the present time leaning toward the new EFB-resistant gene pollinizer varieties released by OSU's Hazelnut Breeding Program, which are Eta, Felix, Gamma, Theta, and York. Here is a list of new varieties with the Gasaway resistance gene and their recommended pollinizers.




HARVESTING CLEAN & DRY MEANS HIGHER RETURNS

As a hazelnut grower, you know harvesting in dry weather maintains quality and saves on grower dockage. But did you know it can make you big money? **Look closely at cleaning and drying costs – you'll see \$0.05-\$0.10 or more of your field price chiseled away by bringing in wet and dirty hazelnuts.**

Most hazelnut processors subsidize the cost of cleaning and drying. However, **the more dirt, debris, and moisture (DD&M) the grower brings in, the more the grower pays of the cleaning and drying costs.** The Hazelnut Growers Bargaining Association designed its sliding scale to reward growers who maintain their hazelnuts and deliver the high quality that Oregon markets demand.

A grower with 10% DD&M pays just a little over \$0.03/lb., while growers with 40% DD&M pay over \$0.10/lb. — that's 3x as much! **By harvesting early, you not only save money, but you help boost Oregon hazelnuts' reputation as the highest quality in the world.**
